Her published books are 'In The Shape Of Sun' Israel, 1972-73, 'The Colors Cry In Rain' U.S., 1983, and 'Ever Sunset', India, 1992. Her work has appeared in innumerable journals and websites in 190 countries and has been translated into seven languages. It has also been recorded on cassette by The International Library Of Poetry and on CD by The Poet House.

She is a Distinguished member of The International Society of

Poets and a Member of World Academy of Arts and Culture, among several other memberships. She is included in many International Biographical books of poets.
