

# Hapless India lost to the Aussie assault in the World Cup '23 Finale

It is not digestible that India lost to Aussies in the CWC '23 finals while winning all 10 matches played on the trot. Even in the build up to the final, India beat Aussie comprehensively. But India's performance in the final is not worth taking note of. Number of blemishes on the part of India are the cause of concern.

A paltry score of 240 runs was not a difficult target for opposition and that too Aussies.

The Ahmedabad pitch where the ball was not coming on to bat at rapid pace was not an easy pitch to bat on. The pitch too assisted spinners, as well. The life was not a cake walk for batters. In a situation like this, application was the key which Aussie's Travis Head did to perfection. It was not easy for Head in the middle but he stood his ground after being beaten invariably. He posted a resolute century for Aussie cause. Head turned out to be the difference between India's victory or defeat.

Team India definitely is a top class team but in key matches they are in total disarray.

Shubham Gill's shot was not on, playing an airy fairy shot at a crucial juncture was the first turning point of the match. That turned the tide in Australia's favour. Gill is the most important cog in Indian line up. Aussies took full advantage

with early in-roads and put a break on the run-rate.

Iyer too was undone by Cummins's special and India's ship was dismantled by these two important scalps.

Rohit, Kohli and Rahul were in good nick but could not extend their innings to centuries.

Surya looked the most vulnerable of the lot because his game is stylized in T-20 mode. But this happens to be a situation when wickets were tumbling in regular intervals and Surya's stay in the middle became absolutely inevitable. He was always found in two-minds whether to go for his shots or play a restrained knock. Surya never looks at ease when in defensive mode.

Three players were primarily responsible for India's dismal game – GILL, IYER AND SURYA.

Among Indian pacers, in particular, Bumrah was unlucky not to have gotten the edges of the bat. He was swinging the ball enormously but of not much avail.



Another disappointing factor was KL Rahul 's show behind the stumps.

There is a saying that the captain should not tinker with the winning ways. Rohit did this mistake by opting to open the attack with Bumrah and Shami and not with Bumrah and Siraj. Shami comes in as a first change. Pundits will not comment on this change because Shami is the highest wicket taker in the tournament.

To conclude, Aussies is a team well equipped to play key matches in style which they did to perfection and lifted the ICC Trophy.

How can you describe VIRAT KOHLI? He considers Sachin Tendulkar as his hero although he has surpassed Sachin's record of 49 ODI tons. Virat Kohli stands tall with 50 ODI tons and is supremely fit at the age of 35 yrs. Virat's approach to batting is monumental. He plays his game studied with sublime shots along the ground. He takes full measure of the proceedings which include pitch behaviour, movement or spin imparted by bowlers before launching for his shots. He brings in some kind of stability to the proceedings so that from the other end batters can bloom and maintain a healthy run rate. In other words, Virat is the backbone of Indian Cricket whose presence in the middle gives lot of confidence to other batters to express themselves.

In the on-going ICC tournament, India has knocked down all the teams so as to pave a berth in the finals.

In the semis, India was pitted against New Zealand considered to be one of the favourites to lift the trophy.

After winning the all-crucial toss, Rohit chose to bat first on a wicket where there was not much on offer for the bowlers.

Rohit, as an opener, launched a blistering attack on Kiwi bowlers and set the tone of the match with his trademark shots. Rohit's ability to see the ball early enables him to pull and hook the ball disdainly. Right from the word go, he puts the opposition on backfoot, such is his class to command the proceedings. His brutal attack up-front leaves the bowlers a demoralized unit.

All Indian batters are in prime form, be it Gill, Iyer, Rahul or Jadeja.

The highlights of the match was contributions from two centurians – KOHLI and IYER, 80 by Gill and 47 by Rohit.

Iyer's 6-hitting ability enabled India to put up a mammoth total of 397 runs on board. A target such as this is in

itself a daunting task for Kiwi batters.

in this tournament, India's basket of pace bowlers is overflowing. In Bumrah, Shami and Siraj, India cannot expect a better pace attack. Shami, in particular, makes in-roads when there is a sign of partnership build up. In this tournament, Shami has bagged 5 and above wicket haul three times. 5 wickets are considered equivalent to a century. In the semifinal he took an astounding 7 wicket haul.

From Kiwi's side, Mitchel and Williamson put up some kind of resistance to the proceedings and steadied the drowning Kiwi ship. (Mitchel 139 and Williamson 69). But this was not enough and Kiwis lost the match by a margin of 70 runs.

India has entered the finals and shall face Aussies for they beat Protos by three wickets in the second semis to get a berth in the finals. The ICC Trophy is just a match away from the hot favourites – INDIA.

## **Farewell Bishan Singh Bedi, your left-arm spin had left the batters mesmerised**

At one point in time, India's cup for fast bowling was empty. At that time, the lone fast bowler representing India was Kapil Dev. During that time India introduced a 3-pronged spin quartet of Bedi, Prasanna and Chandrasekhar.

India also produced spin-friendly pitches so that they can thrive on the advantage against opposition.

During the same period, simultaneously Clive Lloyd of West Indies introduced a 4-pronged pace attack to ridicule the world. Those bowlers were all charged and raring-to-go in order to break the opposition into pieces. They were Malcolm Marshall, Joel Garner, Andy Roberts and Machiel Holding, with the bench strength of Colin Croft.

With the kind of attack India had at its disposal, they could not pose much of problems to opposition, especially West Indies.

But Bishan Singh Bedi's left-arm spin left the batters mesmerised with subtle variations. He was one cog in the Indian armoury who never diminished.

Bedi is no more. At the age of 77 yrs, recently he passed away. Bedi was an out-spoken character. He single-handedly fought for the cause of players. He also imparted his art of spin bowling to budding cricketers. In fact Bedi was considered leader among three spinners.

After his playing days, Bedi also held the position of Manager for Team India. But his stint as Manager did not prove result oriented.

Now India's cup of bowling is brimming with quality batsmen, spinners and seamers alike. India no more relies on spin-friendly pitches. Even quality players do not find a place in the side and have to cool their heels on the bench.

On the contrary, West Indies is no longer a team to reckon

with. They even could not qualify to play for the ICC World Cup. West Indies athletes are not much interested in playing cricket and switched alliance towards basketball which is a comparatively much more lucrative sport.

It is heartening to note that India's graph in cricket is on the up-swing whereas West Indies is left far behind in the race.

From New Zealand side, Ravinderan and Mitchel batted in tandem and New Zealand posted a score of 273 runs on the board.

In the second essay, Rohit Sharma hit 48 runs in his usual manner. India's ship was steadied by Kohli with 95 runs and Jadeja with 45 runs. Shami in particular bowled with a 5-wicket haul.

The contest between bat and ball never took off and it turned out to be a one sided affair, which, unbelievably, India won by 10 wickets. # WHEN KAPIL'S DEVILS DETHRONED THE MIGHTY WEST INDIES

It was 1983, the no-hopers or you may say the 'under-dogs' gave the all-crucial blow to West Indies cricket by beating them in one-dayers at Lords, England.

Before embarking upon the tournament at England, Indian Team did not expect any positive results from the World Cup. Their confidence level went a few notches up as the matches start unfolding. Early wins gave them the necessary confidence that they could also reach the play-offs. The confidence was given necessary boost by the captain Kapil Dev in a match against Zimbabwe when India was tottering with five top batsman having returned to the pavilion empty handed.

From then onwards, the pendulum shifted India's way when Kapil

Dev arrived on the crease. He scored 175 runs, which was considered to be the best ever innings played in a one dayer. It was a difficult wicket to bat on, but Kapil being a genuine all-rounder in the world shone with the bat and changed the course of the match. Sunil Gavaskar admitted that in his life time he had not seen such an outstanding inning in one dayers, such was the master class of Kapil Dev as an explosive batsman. 4s and 6s rained from his blade in a magical show of batsmanship.

Unfortunately, the match could not be telecast on air due to technical hitches.

This inning was the turn-around of India's fortune in the world cup. People still remember this inning with a sigh of relief. With this inning, Kapil Dev became an overnight hero in the tournament. Kapil leading from the front and his exploits percolated on his team mates and gave them unbelievable self-belief.

Interestingly, Indian Team had in their ranks the luxury of multi-skilled players.

MOHINDER AMARNATH : A top order batsman and a military medium swing bowler.

KAPIL DEV : A genuine all-rounder

BALVINDER SINGH SANDHU : A genuine swing bowler who could bat a bit also.

ROGER BINNY : A medium pacer who could chip in with some runs too.

MADAN LAL : A fine medium pacer who could bat as well.

In fact, India succeeded in reaching the final on the basis of these all round performers because English conditions suited their bowling the most.

The final between the mighty West Indies and the underdogs India was scheduled to be played in the Mecca of Cricket ie.

Lords at England. But West Indies became over-confident to lift upon being seeing that they are pitted up against the minnows India.

Batting first, India put up a paltry score of 180 odd runs on the board with Kris Srikant top scoring with 38 runs.

The first turning point of the match happened when Balvinder Singh Sandhu's delivery pitching outside off stump swung in viciously, leaving Gordon Greenidge bowled and bamboozled. With this wicket in pocket, Indian Team looked pumped up. The drama started to unfold when a rampaging Viv Richards hit a skyer of a Madan Lal delivery and Kapil Dev took a catch of the match running backwards. This was perhaps the second turning point of the match. These two dismissals turned the tide in India's favour.

Mohinder Amarnath's military medium did most of the damage and wisely declared Man of the Match.

The no-hopers turned heroes and World Champs under the captain cool Kapil Dev. Kapil Dev's contribution was of immense value to the Team India. It was a herculean task for no-hopers but luck played a vital role for Team India. 1983 Indian Cricket Team members are written in golden letters in the history books.

The WTC final cricket test match played between India and Australia at The Oval, England was a mouth-watering contest. There was juice on offer for fast bowlers and life for batters was not a cake-walk at all. Indian fast bowlers did not bowl at the right areas in the first outing, enabling Aussies to take early initiative and advantage in the match. Aussies amassed a mammoth 479 in the first innings. It was a daunting



task for India to take on 4-pronged pace attack of Australia. Of the 4, Boland was the most difficult to deal with. The first innings scalp of Gill by Boland was a treat to watch. The ball pitched well outside the off stump but jagged back and uprooted the stumps.

One particular noticeable factor was when once a batsman settles down after gauging the behaviour of the pitch, it becomes imperative on his part to play a disciplined knock and not over-indulge. Once India is in a precarious situation, batters going for expensive shots leads to their downfall. The most difficult corridor for a batsman is off stump and just outside off stump. Generally, it is the away going delivery which creates trouble for batters but when bowlers swing one in, it is absolutely nightmarish for the batters.

Batting on helpful tracks for batters call for a great deal of concentration, determination and application.

In the second essay, Indian batters Rohit, Pujara and Kohli all perished after making good start and making necessary adjustment.

For Aussie fast bowlers above 6 ft plus height get extraordinary lift and bounce from the wicket. All Aussie fast bowlers are above 6 ft.

If we talk about Rohit Sharma's batting, his batting involves lot of risk-taking shots. Pulls and hooks are his favourite shots but controlling these shots is equally important. He may get a lot of runs playing such shots but there is an element of risk involved. Anything misqued goes to waiting hands.

I think Gill has to make lot of adjustment in playing outside off stump line.

Pujara these days has changed his style of play. He need not be over enthusiastic in playing shots. Pujara of old was much more secure and stood like a wall for other batters to score

bulk of runs.

In this match, India badly missed the services of Bumrah because of injury. For India it was a testing time but Aussie is a class act. Let us hope with the recovery of Pant, India poses more solidarity to the side in the future.

# CSK vs GT – a thrilling, nail-biting IPL final, down to the last ball

Chennai Super Kings (CSK) led by MS Dhoni and Gujarat Titans (GT) led by Hardik Pandya were pitted against each other to play for IPL 2023 Final. The venue of the match was Ahmedabad

but the match on Sunday was washed out due to incessant rain and re-scheduled for play on Monday.

It was a belter of a pitch but for initial seam movement that provided little spin.

Dhoni, after winning the toss elected to bowl first, considering that in the event of intervening rain, the contest shall be reduced in target and number of overs. It will benefit the team batting second. In the ultimate analysis his prediction proved right and CSK lifted the IPL 2023 trophy for the 5th time.

A few salient features emerged from the match. They are enumerated below :-

1) The stumping effected by Dhoni of in-form Shubham Gill off the bowling of Ravinder Jadeja was a mercurial work behind the stump. Mind you Gill notched up 3 centuries on the trot before this match. and was a hot favourite facilitating GT to lift the trophy.

2) For Gujarat Titans the stand-out performers with the bat were Sai Sudershan and Saha. They both batted brilliantly and posted a formidable total of 200 +.

3) With the intervention of, rain after the first inning, the contest was limited by a reduction in overs and scaling down of the target.

4) The relatively disappointing factor was that the match could not be decided in a 20-over contest.

5) Even though MS Dhoni was not fully fit and one of his knees not taking the rigorous of running between the wicket, he has not called it quit from IPL and shall appear in the next year's IPL too for CSK.

In conclusion, as per the post tournament analysis, some of the batters have performed exceptionally well.

- 1) To start with, Shubham Gill has notched up three tons.
- 2) Followed by Virat Kohli who posted two back to back hundreds with a fifty.
- 3) Batters like Ishan Kishan, Nitish Rana, Rinku Singh and Surya Kr Yadav stole the show exhibiting T-20 style of shots. They redefined the game of cricket by introducing the formula – throwing caution to the wind.

A batsman needs to adjust to conditions first and plan which shot should be played and which not.

Kohli with 76 International tons in his pocket in all formats has enormous experience and exposure to any given condition. He therefore is the backbone of Indian batting and other just revolve around him. Dislodging him therefore becomes next to impossible. He stands tall among his contemporaries.

People and his die-hard foes becomes so critical about his inclusion in the side when he goes thru patchy and lean periods. They immediately write him off but Kohli has in him to bounce back with vengeance.

Kohli proclaims; "As long as God so desires, I shall keep on playing for India.

He is a modern-day iconic figure and others just want to emulate his work ethics.

He stands tall among the legendary figures India has produced so far.

If he remains fit and rarin-to-go, he will set such high benchmarks that he will be hard to dislodge.
