Paper's Tim, a playfully sane group in the local theatre scene, put up a new play, *Tim Ko Chien Ji* at the Grand in Victoria Park's Theatre on a third floor level after the basement had been lost.

The play begins with a slight suspense. Paper's Tim and assistant Paper's Ko Chien Ji is a two-hour long play which is both a comedy and a tragedy. The play is a performance covering the entire emotional range with a sensitivity and depth undreamed of by a play of her apparent age.
